We also offer knowledge and expert advice on installing renewable energy at home, greener travel including electric vehicles and ebikes and cutting water waste.

Warmer Homes Scotland is back



The Scottish Government's Warmer Homes Scotland programme is back up and running with more funding and more help available for households to install energy-efficient home improvements.

Since its launch in 2015, the programme has helped more than 35,000 households across Scotland, with funding worth £10,000 or more. Warmer Homes Scotland can help fund a range of energy-saving home improvements like new heating systems, wall and loft insulation, draught-proofing and even home renewables.

Kathleen, a Warmer Homes Scotland customer said, "In 24 hours I had 7 new radiators, a heat pump and a new boiler – all paid for by Warmer Homes Scotland. Everything worked out really well and I definitely think I chose the right system for the house."



Get cosy with our winter energy saving tips



Follow our tips* and advice for quick and easy ways to save energy, lower your bills and reduce your carbon footprint. Whether you're a homeowner, a private or social renter, a student, or you live with your parents, there are many things you can do. Take a look at our quick tips and see how much you could save.

- 1. Your thermostat should be set to the lowest comfortable temperature, typically between 18 and 21 degrees Celsius. You don't need to turn your thermostat up when it is colder outside; the house will heat up to the set temperature regardless. Dropping the heat by just 1 degree could save £100 on your heating bills and 305kg of carbon dioxide a year from your household carbon footprint.
- 2. You can quickly and easily reduce the amount of energy you use by remembering to turn your appliances off standby mode. Almost all electrical and electronic appliances can be turned off at the plug without interfering with their settings, saving you around £55 a year on your energy bill. Find out more about what to look for when <u>choosing appliances</u>.
- 3. With the shorter days and longer nights, you'll probably be spending much more time indoors. Customise your heating controls for weekdays and weekends to keep your home comfy all week long. Installing a room thermostat, a programmer and thermostatic radiator valves and using these controls efficiently could reduce your energy usage and save you around £120 a year.
- 4. Switching to energy efficient lights such as LED spotlights could help you save energy this winter. LEDs come in a variety of shapes, sizes and fittings if the average household replaced all their bulbs with LEDs, it could save up to £60 a year.
- 5. Swap your bath for a shower! Some of us might enjoy a long soak in the bath but swapping just one bath a week with a 4-minute shower could save you £55 a year on your energy bills. Find out how <u>saving water at home</u> can help your wallet and the environment.

eBike trials for NHS staff

Do you or someone you know work in the NHS? Home Energy Scotland Strathclyde & Central is offering free ebike trials for NHS staff who operate out of GP surgeries, health centres and hospitals.

Funded by Energy Saving Trust and The Scottish Government, the main aim of the project is to help raise awareness of how ebikes can be used to save money, improve the environment, and also increase staff wellbeing.

A trial ebike in your workplace could be used:

- For staff commuting
- For health or care worker home visits
- To encourage staff wellbeing through leisure use
- For patients use (i.e., for health or rehabilitation) based on the idea that the surgery/practice/hospital were open to facilitating their own trials
